In the form you will have the option to identify which program(s) you are applying to - select Link Crew and it will take you to the Link Crew-specific application questions.

Link Crew Application Questions

On the Google Form you will be asked to respond to the following questions. Instructions for submitting your responses are in the Google Form.

First Time Link Leader Questions:

What was your 9th-grade year like? What elements were most valuable during your transition into high school? How will you use that experience to inform your actions as a Link Leader?

Complete this sentence: (This teacher – put a teacher's name here) would say that I should be a Link Leader because....

Write a 6-word slogan describing yourself and your beliefs. (Only 6 words!)

If you were an inanimate (non-living) object, what would you be and why? Explain.

What else should we know about you that would help us understand why you would make a good Link Leader?

Returning Link Leader Questions:

What are one or two experiences from this year in your role as a Link Leader that stand out to you as meaningful?

What are a few ways that you tried to connect with your 9th graders this year? What did you learn from these experiences?

If you are re-accepted to Link Crew for next year, what are two goals you would have for yourself as a Link Leader?

Write a six-word slogan describing yourself as a leader and your perspective on a Link Leader's role at Tam. (Only SIX words!)

Is there anything else we should know when considering your application to return to our program?

WORKING WITH MR. LOVEJOY'S STUDENTS

(optional variation of being a Link Crew Leader)

- Two students will be selected to work with Mr. Lovejoy's special ed students.
- Students chosen to be a part of this team will not be given a group of 9th graders but will instead work separately to support and integrate the students in Mr. Lovejoy's class with the rest of the Tam student body.

LINK CREW CLASS (optional for Link Leaders)

Who joins the Link Crew class?

- Any Link Leader who wants to join the class has the option to do so. You can also be a Link Leader and NOT join the Link Crew class.
- While enrolling in the Link Crew class isn't required for Link Leaders, <u>applicants who commit to taking</u> the class will be given special consideration during our selection process because we must have a certain number of students enrolled to run the class.
